



Phil from Japanese Auto Locators (JAL) has been in touch to tell us about their plans to beat the land speed record for a campervan. JAL have for many years been supplying and converting Mazda Bongos but they also sell other "grey imports" and the record attempt will be made in a souped-up 500 bhp Honda Stepwagon. According to the Guinness Book of Records the current record is 141.3 mph (227 km/h) in a converted Fiat Diablo on 21/10/14. Phil and his team are aiming for 175 mph in a fully kitted-out Stepwagon with elevating roof and side kitchen unit. For the latest news on the attempt see www.jalimports.co.uk. Thirty Years of the Mazda Bongo



On 19th April 1995 the first commercially available Mazda Bongo Friendee rolled off the production line. It was a 2-wheel drive diesel Bongo. It did not have an elevating roof. It had the chassis number SGLR-100011, so presumably there were 10 demonstration models before this. Five years ago we were due to hold the 25th anniversary celebrations but something unexpected arrived...Covid.

Next year's actual anniversary falls on Easter Saturday so put it in your diary as there will be a number of day meetings around the UK. If you would like to organise one of these then get in touch. Venues will be announced in the New Year.

The longest recorded swearing session by a Bongo owner was by Peter Dullimore (aged 59) of Cirencester, England, on 6 April 2003. While trying to remove an exhaust manifold stud, Mr Dullimore grazed all his knuckles and his elbow, and then went on to swear for 11 minutes and 13 seconds without stopping or using the same swear word twice

Mr Dullimore later made an attempt to beat his own record live on Sky TV's 'Record Busters' programme by dropping a 105 amp Bongo battery on his foot. It ended in failure when he repeated the word 'bastard' after 9 minutes and 49 seconds.

The largest bill for work that didn't need carrying out on a Bongo is £7,298.65 (including VAT) which was charged by Dave Orkney & Sons of Poole, Dorset, England, in July 2006. Calling in for a routine service on her 1997 Mazda Bongo, Mrs Alison Perry subsequently agreed to pay for, among other things, new off-side trumpets (£825), replacement of a cracked gangle pin (£950), realignment of muff tension bracket bearing (£140), a set of hexagonal tag nuts and dongle springs (£1,685) and a full set of piss-take valves (£1,060).

Mrs Perry also later discovered that the vehicle had clocked up 6,000 miles during the four weeks it had been in the garage. She also received a speeding summons from the Italian police.

The longest traffic jam caused by a Bongo driver was by Dave Cameron from the Isle of Lewis, Scotland. Setting off on a trip to the National Bongo Bash in Worcestershire in June 2007, and having previously never driven further than Stornoway, Mr Cameron stopped at traffic lights just north of Glasgow to fiddle with his SatNav system. He then sat oblivious through 217 cycles of traffic light changes, causing a traffic jam tailback to Helensburgh (17 miles) and gridlock around the Greater Strathclyde area that took police three days to clear.

When interviewed by the police, Mr Cameron said that he 'had some issues' with his SatNav system and would return to the Isle of Lewis for 'a wee bit more practise.' He never did make it to the Bongo Bash.

The most impressive display of multi-task driving in a Bongo was recorded by Mr Mark Dangerfield of Rugby, England, on 15 February 2004. Whilst driving at 92mph in freezing fog on the M6 motorway, Mr Dangerfield simultaneously shaved, ate a sandwich, dictated a letter to his secretary, read a road map, filled in an expenses claim, took his jacket off and spoke to his wife on his mobile phone.
